Course Syllabus Bexley Middle School Mr. Jordan

Course Overview:

Fine Arts at Bexley Middle School is based upon Comprehensive Art Education (formerly Discipline Based Art Education), which includes Art Criticism, History, Aesthetics, Multiculturalism, and Studio. Course work also follows the Bexley City School District's Fine Arts Course of Study.

You will experience a variety of art materials and artists through many different assignments, minor projects, and major projects. Building upon your elementary arts education, you will achieve an understanding of: a) art, b) its role in history and culture, c) art careers, d) use of art as a communication tool, e) responsibility for developing creative and thoughtful work habits, and f) its connections with other disciplines.

Course Expectations:

- 1. Students will understand and obey school/classroom rules.

Grading:

Fine Arts at BMS is a graded class, and is part of your calculated G.P.A. You will not be graded on your artistic abilities, but you will be graded upon your participation, following of directions, completion of assignments, and turning assignments in. All work should be completed in class or during advisory, exception being homework or make-up work. You will be given an assessment tool (such as a rubric) so that you are aware of what exactly is being graded.

Homework: There are a few homework assignments, as well as studying for quizzes, and possibly a donation of an old magazine. Also, homework is assigned to make up for absences.

Assignments: Small class assignments (ex. written interpretation) will worth 10 - 50 points each. Usually there are 3 - 6 small class assignments.

Minor Projects: Minor projects (ex: two-day still life drawing) are worth 25 - 50 points each, and there are usually 3 - 5 minor projects.

Major Projects: Major projects (ex. Homeroom logo, which takes approximately 2 weeks) are worth 100 points each. Usually students complete 6 - 8 major projects.

Second Chance Opportunity: Students will be able to retake quizzes, and re-submit minor/major projects to achieve a satisfactory grade, provided they obtain extra help before the retake. All assignments are due by the end of the quarter – if a project isn't finished in class during the allotted time, students will need to finish these outside of class.

Parent/Teacher Communication Plan:

Teacher initiated communication with parents is through open house, student-led conferences, and report cards. Phone calls home will occur if there is concern about a student's grade or behavior.
